Explanation of activities for teacher

Pre-reading

Activity number 1: cover the titles and ask the learner what things does he or she think are part of a house or just objects.

 Then, ask the learner to take the words in the envelope, and place them in the correct image.

Activity number 2: ask the learner to the gestures with her or his hands while saying the words, as much as you think is necessary for the children to make the connection between the words and what it means.

 Then ask the student to mention some small things, some big things, some huge and enormous things, to see if the student understood.

Activity number 3: in this activity ask the learner to match the adjectives with the images, in order to introduce a little bit to the way those adjectives will be presented in the reading.

Explanation of activities for teacher

While-reading

Activity number 4: ask the student to point out what is Olive likes, to see if he or she knows so far what the reading is about.

 Then ask the learner to say somethings he or she remembers about what Olivia has tell so far in the story.

Activity number 5: ask the student to place the yes or not in each of the sentences (the yes and the not little circle are in the envelope at the beginning of the book).

 Then ask the learner about what he or she thinks is going to happen.

Post-reading

Activity number 6: in this activity ask the student to paste the check mark or the wrong mark in the correct sentence.

 Then ask the learner what other details he or she remembers about the story.

Activity number 7: ask the learner to put the images in order by numbering them.

 Then ask the learner to write what he or she remembers about those moments in the story.
